

SELF-ASSESSMENT

(IMMIGRANT PARTNER CATEGORY)

In order to be considered under the Newfoundland and Labrador Provincial Nominee Program an applicant must achieve a **minimum of 50 points** in the assessment rating and qualify under Factor 1 - Proposed Business. Applicants should assess themselves to determine whether they are likely to qualify. If married, both spouses may wish to complete a self-assessment. The spouse who has the highest number of overall points should apply as the principal applicant and identify the other spouse as a dependent.

A Program Officer will assess the application based on the same factors and must assign 10 points to Factor 1 and at least 50 points out of 100 overall for consideration under the Newfoundland and Labrador Program. If there is a difference between the points the applicant has assigned and those of the Program Officer, the Officer's assessment will prevail. You may be asked to submit additional information to assist the final assessment.

Note: Maximum points available in each factor may change without notice.

The application will be evaluated based on the Strategic Sector List in effect on the date the application is received by the Department of Innovation, Trade and Rural Development. The Strategic Sector List can be viewed at www.nlpnp.ca

Obtaining the minimum score of 50, or any other score, does not automatically qualify an applicant to be a Provincial Nominee. There are a number of other factors to be considered by the province before exercising its prerogative in nominating any candidate as a Provincial Nominee.

For each factor, enter your factor assessment score in the “**SCORE**” box.

FACTOR 1: PROPOSED BUSINESS

The applicant’s proposed business must be consistent with the Strategic Sector List to qualify under the Newfoundland and Labrador Provincial Nominee Program. The applicant must receive ten (10) points under Factor 1 to be considered under the Provincial Nominee Program.

FACTOR 2: RELATED WORK EXPERIENCE IN PROPOSED BUSINESS

Points are awarded based on the number of years experience the principal applicant has in the intended business during the last five (5) years.

FACTOR 3: BUSINESS EXPERIENCE

Points are awarded based on the assessment of the business owned or managed by the applicant in three (3) of the past five (5) years prior to the application being filed.

FACTOR 4: EDUCATION

Points are awarded for the applicant's highest level of education and/or highest level of training. If you have studied less than the number of years listed with your highest educational credential, you must award yourself points that match your years of study. The maximum points you can score is 20.

FACTOR 5: ADAPTABILITY

Points are awarded for the applicant's and the dependent's potential to settle in Newfoundland and Labrador. -You can only count points from each category once. You can claim points from a category either for you, or for your spouse or common-law partner, but not for both.

FACTOR 6: AGE

Points are awarded based on the age of the applicant on the date the application is received.

FACTOR 7: LANGUAGE ABILITY

The ability to communicate and work in one or both of Canada's official languages is very important. The principal applicant is to identify the language in which he/she has the greatest fluency in reading, speaking and writing.

The applicant may also note the level of language ability in both languages; however, only the highest scoring language ability score will be considered in the total assessment score. Applicants may be requested to submit further assessment documentation respecting language.

DEFINITIONS:

High Proficiency: The applicant can communicate effectively in a range of social and employment situations. The applicant can communicate in a professional situation.

Moderate Proficiency: The applicant can communicate reasonably well in relation to familiar situations, such as in the area of professional expertise and personal settings.

Basic Proficiency: The applicant has only minimal knowledge and can only speak, write or read a few words. The applicant would require language training.

No Proficiency: The applicant has no knowledge of the English or French language.
